



Supplemental Notice to Permit Holders

In many instances, property owners or contractors place fences, rocks/boulders, trees/shrubs, unyielding mailboxes, earthwork or other objects within the road right-of-way as a measure of improving landscape. However, these fixed objects often become hazards to errant motorists, vision obstructions, or interference to public utilities. Any encroachment within the county road right-of-way may be subject to removal (Act 368 of 1925).

We ask your cooperation in keeping the highway right-of-way free of all obstructions other than standard mailboxes and mailbox supports. Acceptable mailbox standards are provided below:

- Mailbox is of light steel, aluminum or plastic construction that meets U. S. Postal Service requirements.
- No more than two mailboxes per support structure.
- Mailbox post is not set in concrete or filled with any material.
- Mailbox post is a single wood or metal post.
- Wood post does not exceed 4-inch x 4-inch square or 4½ inch diameter round.
- Metal post does not exceed weight of 3 lbs./ft.
- Mailbox is adequately attached to the post to prevent separation if impacted by a motor vehicle.
