

HURON VALLEY FEDERAL AID COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES
October 3, 2024 - 11:00 A.M.
Livingston County Road Commission

1. Roll Call and Introductions

Steve Wasylk, Managing Director of the Livingston County Road Commission, called the meeting of the Huron Valley Federal Aid Committee (HVFAC) to order at 11:00 a.m. A sign-in sheet was circulated, and all attendees introduced themselves. The sign-in sheet is included as Attachment A of these minutes.

3. Approval of Minutes

- Meeting of July 17, 2024

Erv Suida from the City of Howell moved to approve the minutes as presented for the meeting of July 17, 2024. Marcel Goch from the City of Brighton supported the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

4. 2026-2029 TIP

- Approval of Urban Projects

Steve Wasylk presented the Committee with the list of projects approved by the Funding Committee for the 2026-2029 TIP. Mr. Wasylk provided an overview of the selection process and provided details for the Livingston County Road Commission projects. Erv Suida from the City of Howell, Marcel Goch from the City of Brighton, and T.J. Connolly from the Road Commission for Oakland County provided details for their respective projects. A short question and answer session then ensued. Once all questions had been answered, Sean Dunleavy from Oceola Township moved to accept the 2026-2029 TIP as presented. Michael Sedlak from Green Oak Township supported the motion. The motion was unanimously approved. The approved project list is shown as Attachment B of these minutes.

- Approval of Rural Projects

Steve Wasylk presented the Committee with the list of proposed rural projects for the 2026-2029 TIP. Mr. Wasylk explained that the Livingston County Road Commission and the Village of Fowlerville were the only two agencies eligible for the rural funding portion of the TIP. Joe White from the Village of

Fowlerville provided details for their proposed projects on Grand River Avenue, and Steve Wasylk provided details for the Livingston County Road Commission's proposed project on Fowlerville Road. Marcel Goch from the City of Brighton then moved to accept the rural projects for the 2026-2029 TIP as presented. Erv Suida from the City of Howell supported the motion. The motion was unanimously approved. The approved project list is shown as Attachment C of these minutes.

5. Report from Livingston Essential Transportation Service (LETS)

Adam Baranski from LETS inquired about receiving timely information regarding road closures related to the numerous MDOT construction projects. Steve Wasylk responded that the Emergency Responder Notifications sent out by MDOT provided the most timely and accurate information.

6. Report from Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG)

Michele Fedorowicz from SEMCOG reviewed the approval process for the 2026-2029 TIP. Ms. Fedorowicz added that the call for CMAQ and Carbon Reduction projects has been issued and that the submittal deadline was December 9th.

- **Multimodal Tool Presentation**

Brian Pawlik from SEMCOG conducted a presentation of their Multimodal Tool. Mr. Pawlik explained that the Multimodal Tool can be used to view modal networks and tiers, identify project corridors, review modal priorities, and determine land use contexts. This information can then be used to set up a project and design cross-sections to best serve the prioritized modes in a given land use context. In addition, the tool provides a level of service by mode to help evaluate the design. Mr. Pawlick stated that the Multimodal Tool was free and available on SEMCOG's website. Lastly, Mr. Pawlick indicated that questions about the use of the Multimodal Tool should be directed to Jenya Abramovich or himself.
